Instructions for submitting proposals for papers

Members are invited to propose papers on the general theme of *Material Literacy* for the 2027 CIETA Congress to be held at Uppsala University, Sweden. The content of a paper must be original and previously unpublished.

Please note that presentations are a **maximum** of 20 minutes in length (plus 10 minutes for a discussion), even if they are presented by two or more speakers. It is recommended that Powerpoint presentations have no more than 20 slides.

Please use the form (on the next page) to submit your proposal.

The abstract is to be a **maximum of 300 words**. Proposals without abstracts or titles will not be considered.

If you are not a native speaker of French or English, please ask a French or English speaking person to read and (if necessary) correct your text in order to avoid misinterpretations and additional copy editing; the CIETA Vetting Committee will be grateful for your cooperation in this.

Please send in your proposal in this form by **26 June 2026**. Proposals arriving after this date will not be considered.

The CIETA Vetting Committee will consider the proposals and select the papers to be included in the programme of the next congress. The Committee will also consider papers without a direct reference to the general theme. They may be accepted if they are of particular scholarly interest.

All applicants will be informed of the results by **28 August-2026**.
